Mr. James' talk fuses his background in market economics and competition with the emerging leadership challenges we face as we address societal questions of fairness, equity, and inequality.

During a 30-year legal career, Professor James held some of the senior-most positions in American law, including government, private practice, and corporate law. At Chevron, he oversaw the law, corporate governance, global security, and human resources functions of the corporation, and served on all of the company's significant executive, operating, and policy committees.

Before joining Chevron in 2002, Professor James served as Assistant Attorney General in charge of the Antitrust Division of the U.S. Department of Justice in the administration of George W. Bush, a position he also held in the George H.W. Bush administration.
